Child Profile

- ❖ A record is completed for every child entered into the ASQ Online system
- ❖ Includes:
 - ❑ Basic demographic information about a child
 - ❑ Medical history
 - ❑ Information about caregivers

Child Profile

- ❖ For children born premature, enter the number of weeks the child was born premature
- ❖ The system automatically calculates an adjusted age
 - ❑ This helps ensure that the correct ASQ questionnaire interval is always used for screenings

Screening with ASQ Online

- ❖ Print blank questionnaires from the system for parents to complete

OR


- ❖ Parents can complete questionnaires online with ASQ Family Access



Screening with ASQ Online

- ❖ If the parent completed a *paper questionnaire*, enter the results into the system
- ❖ If the parent completed the questionnaire *online*, the results appear the next time a user logs into the system


Entering Screening Results

- ❖ If the user entering in the information skips a question, the system will prompt the user to complete all the questions before proceeding


