- Parent-friendly





About ASQ-3


- Developmental screener
- 21 questionnaires screen children from 1 month to 66 months
- 5 skill areas addressed:
 - Communication
 - Gross motor
 - Fine motor
 - Problem Solving
 - Personal-social

- High reliability & validity
- Researched with more than 15,000 children






About ASQ:SE-2

- Social-emotional screener
- 9 questionnaires screen children from 1 month to 72 months
- 7 areas addressed:
 - Self-regulation
 - Compliance
 - Communication
 - Adaptive behaviors

- Autonomy
- Affect
- Interaction with people










Why ASQ Online?


- Manage screening data efficiently
- Accurate, automated scoring
- Easy reporting
- Time-saving mail-out feature
- Reduce mailing costs with questionnaires parents complete online






About ASQ Online

- Web-based program
 - Access the system from any computer with internet access
- Each user at a program is given a unique username and a password for access






Main Navigation

- ☐ Home
- My Profile—information about your subscription
- Program—information about an organization's various programs, users, and children
- Child Profiles—includes all the child information and screening results
- Screening Management—use to schedule and manage all of the screening and follow-up tasks
- Reports—allows the user to run child reports and program reports
- Family Access—online questionnaire completion



Child Profile


- A record is completed for every child entered into the ASQ Online system
- Includes:
 - Basic demographic information about a child
 - Medical history
 - Information about caregivers





Child Profile

- For children born premature, enter the number of weeks the child was born premature
- The system automatically calculates an adjusted age
 - This helps ensure that the correct ASQ questionnaire interval is always used for screenings





Screening with ASQ Online

Print blank questionnaires from the system for parents to complete

OR

Parents can complete questionnaires online with ASQ Family Access







Screening with ASQ Online

- If the parent completed a paper questionnaire, enter the results into the system
- If the parent completed the questionnaire online, the results appear the next time a user logs into the system



Entering Screening Results

Transfer parent responses to the online system by clicking on the circles under the answers that match the responses








Entering Screening Results


- If a caregiver left an item blank, select the circle under "RESPONSE MISSING"
- If the user entering in the information skips a question, the system will prompt the user to complete all the questions before proceeding





Entering Screening Results


- Users can record and save comments that a parent or caregiver might have written in the margins on their paper questionnaire
- Click on the notes button and enter any comments





Finalizing Screening Results


- Once all the results are entered, the user clicks the Finalize button
 - The questionnaire is automatically scored and saved
- The completed Information Summary Sheet will appear on the screen





Entering Screening Results—Short Form

- The short form contains item numbers and dropdown selections that correspond to the possible answers for each item
- This is very useful for users who have a large number of completed paper questionnaires to enter






Schedule & Manage Screens

- The Screening Management page of ASQ Online is where users can schedule and manage all of the screening and follow-up tasks
- Quick Links are split into four categories:
 - Screenings

 - Tasks


- Packets
 - Documents





Schedule Screening

- Select the "Schedule Screening" Quick Link
- Click "Add Task"
- Fill in the appropriate information for the screening





Schedule Screening

- The new screening has been added to the Screenings Due section
 - Screenings Due—screening tasks that have been scheduled but have not yet been sent out
 - Screenings Out—screening tasks in which the materials have been sent to the caregiver for completion, but have not yet been returned
 - Screening Tasks Completed screening tasks that were created, mailed out, received, and entered into the ASQ Online system





Tasks


- Tasks refer to any non-screening action a user can schedule
- ASQ Online provides users with system tasks
- Program Administrators have the ability to create custom tasks to fit the needs of a program





Communicating with Parents & Professionals


- The Documents and Packets sections help with communication between users, parents, and professionals
- Documents are forms...
 - Provided by ASQ Online
 - Created for a program by the Program Administrator
 - Created by a Provider
- Packets are a group of documents that can be organized and printed together to mail to the caregiver for screening and follow-up actions





Form Templates


- Form templates include...
 - ✓ Blank questionnaires
 - ✓ Intervention activities
 - Letters to parents
 - ✓ Letters to pediatricians
- Programs can also create custom templates





Form Templates

ASQ Online automatically populates many of the blank fields in the various forms with the information contained in the Child Profile for each child you select






Reporting

- Use the Reports section to:
 - ✓ View individual child or group screening results
 - ✓ See a child's progress over time
 - ✓ Track which parents were sent questionnaires but haven't yet returned them



Reporting


Screenings Completed by Child report: shows each child and his or her screening completion history





Screening Results


- Screenings Results report: shows, by child...
 - Each questionnaire interval that has been completed
 - ☐ The date the screening was administered
 - The child's scores for the questionnaire
 - The corresponding cutoffs
 - The child's screening results





Screening Responses

- Screening Responses
 report: shows a list of all
 screenings that have been
 scheduled to be completed
 and whether or not the
 completed screenings have
 been received
- This report helps programs follow-up with parents who have not yet returned completed questionnaires






Family Access: Online Questionnaire Completion

- Optional subscription
- Convenient for parents
- Saves programs printing and postage costs
- Automatically syncs with online management system for scoring and storage






- Family Access provides users the option to customize their webpage:
 - Program logo
 - Welcome text
 - Consent information
- When parents visit this webpage, they are instructed to enter their child's birth date





- The system then automatically calculates which questionnaire should be used
- The parent will then...
 - ✓ Open a PDF of the questionnaire
 - Answer the questions
 - Enters the results online






- After entering all questionnaire information, the parent will see the Thank You page
- The Thank You Page is customizable, and a user could include...
 - A timeframe in which the program will contact the parent to discuss his/her child's ASQ results
 - A list of resources caregivers may find helpful
 - A link to an ASQ-3 Learning Activities handout





- After the parent completes a questionnaire in Family Access, the next time a user logs into the online system, he or she will see the screening marked as new
- The user can now review the results of the screening




ASQ Online Subscription

How to Purchase

- First, purchase ASQ-3 and/or ASQ:SE-2 box of questionnaires
- ASQ Pro, ASQ Enterprise, ASQ Family Access, and ASQ Hub are annual subscriptions
- Annual screen usage billed to the account at a rate of \$0.50 per screen
