

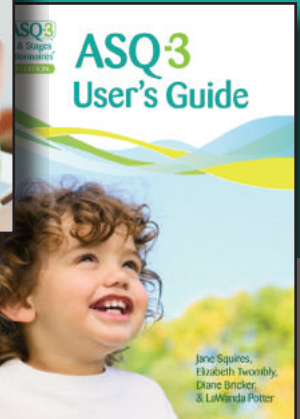
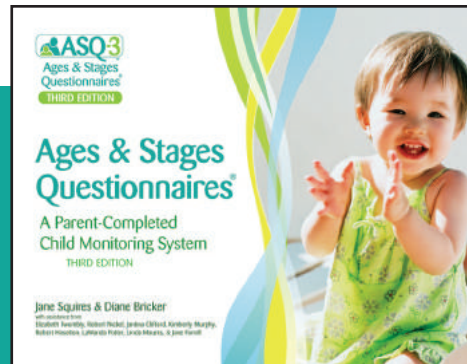

ASQ-3 AT A GLANCE



Type of screening	Developmental screening
Areas screened	Communication, Gross Motor, Fine Motor, Problem Solving, and Personal Social
Age range	1–66 months
Number of questionnaires	21
Age intervals (in months)	2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 22, 24, 30, 33, 36, 42, 48, 54, and 60
Number of items	30 per questionnaire (6 for each area screened)
Sample item	Does your child stack a small block or toy on top of another one? (18-month questionnaire, Fine Motor area)
Reading level of items	4th to 6th grade
Who completes it	Parents (professionals may also if they know the child well)
Time to complete	10–15 minutes
Who scores it	Professionals (teachers, child care providers, nurses, home visitors, early interventionists, clerical staff, pediatricians, and more)
Time to score	2–3 minutes
Scores provided	5 raw scores, one for each area
What the scores tell you	The raw scores are compared to cutoff points for each area, which show whether the child may need further assessment, should be monitored and rescreened, or is doing well.

Languages	Arabic, English, French, Spanish, and Vietnamese
Training	Not required but encouraged! Training DVDs available for purchase as well as in-person introductory and train-the-trainer seminars through Brookes On Location.

Reliability	Test-retest: .92 (excellent) Inter-rater: .93 (excellent)
Validity	.82 to .88 (excellent)
