



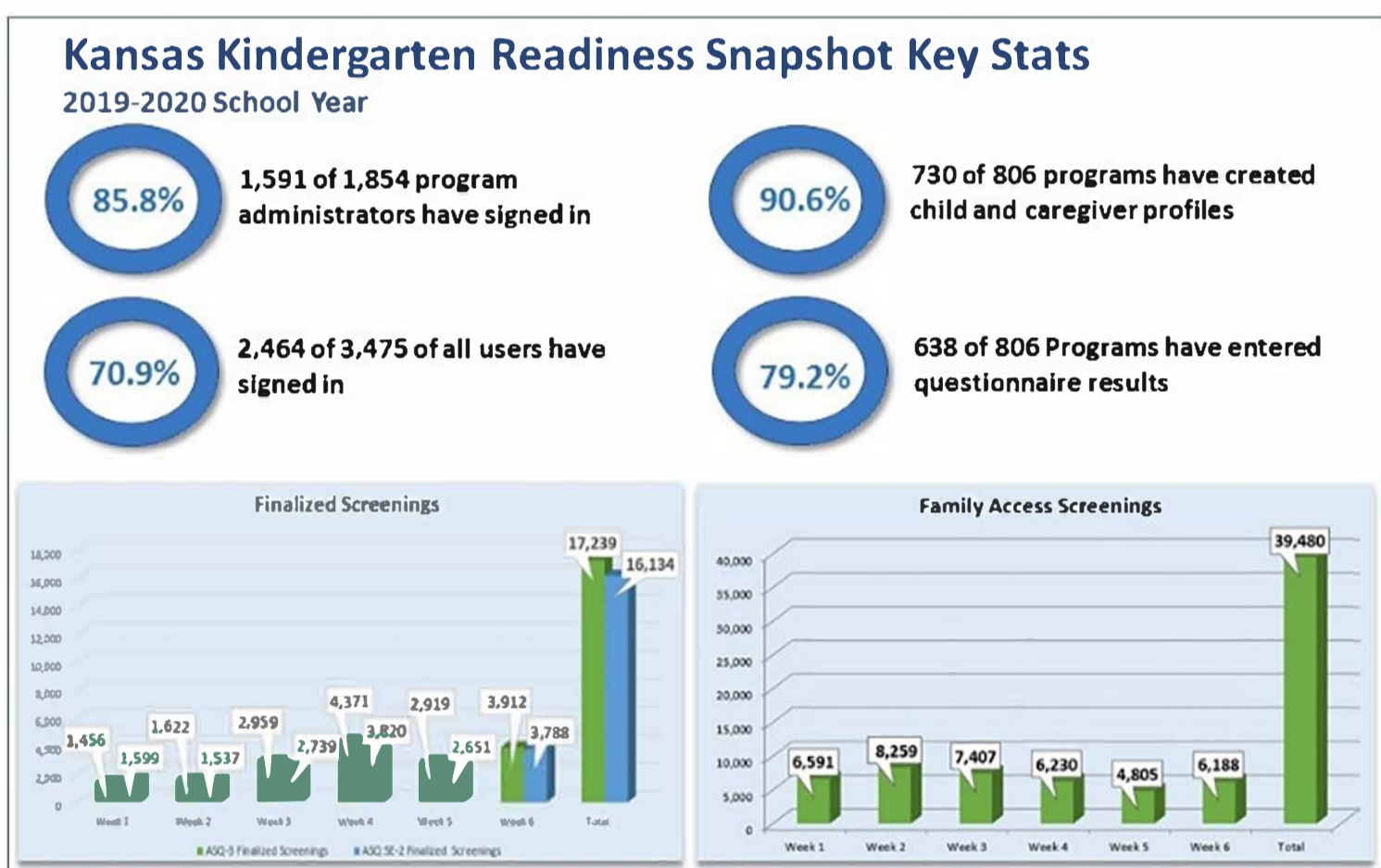

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A message from KSDE

We’re pleased to hear about programs across the state using this powerful tool to support family engagement and personalized learning. All Kansas kindergarten classrooms have until September 20, 2019 to administer the ASQ-3 and the ASQ:SE-2.

A parent may decide not to participate or decide not to have data shared with the state. If parents have opted not to participate in the Kansas Kindergarten Readiness Snapshot, profiles for the child and the parent should still be created in ASQ Online. Teachers should document the parent’s decision to opt out by selecting “Parent/Caregiver opted out of participating” under “Reason for not participating” on a child’s profile page in ASQ Online. Completing the ASQ is a parent’s choice.

All screening data must be entered in to ASQ Online by October 10.

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
