

 Remote Learning Students should be reported in the same building that they are enrolled in. The ASQ is an important opportunity for the classroom teacher to build and strengthen their relationship with the student's family.


What do I need to do to report the data to the state?

You don't have to do anything additional on your end to upload data to KIDS or to a different KSDE authenticated application. The state has an account that allows us to pull that data directly from the same ASQ online system that you work out of. You will need to make sure that you have accepted all of the relevant screenings, so that you have that data complete. The deadline for you to complete the screenings is September 21st, and then the deadline for that data to be finalized is October 9th.


What should I do if a parent/caregiver submits a Family Access screening after the September 21st deadline?

- The Kindergarten Readiness Snapshot (ASQ) is an important opportunity to build your relationship with a child's family to promote kindergarten readiness for the child, family, school, and community.
- If a parent or caregiver submits a screening after the September 21st deadline, you should accept the screening, review the results, engage with the family, and use the data to inform your instruction.

What should I do if a student is older than 77 months 30 days?



Is there a way to review the information summary sheet for more than one student?



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Can you explain the scoring differences between ASQ-3 and ASQ:SE-2?

Interpreting results for ASQ-3 is different from interpreting results for ASQ:SE-2, because the relationship of scores to the cutoff is different. On ASQ-3 scoring BELOW the cutoff indicates a concern, while on ASQ:SE-2 scoring ABOVE the cutoff indicates a concern.


What are the ASQ Learning Activities and how can we use them?

ASQ-3/ASQ:SE-2 Learning Activities

- Enhance the growth and development children with fun, easy-to-use learning activities
- Perfect for sharing with parents and families of children who are developing typically or need non-intensive support in one or more developmental areas or with social-emotional skills







- ASQ-3 Learning Activities encourage progress in the same five developmental areas—communication, gross motor, fine motor, problem solving, and personal-social
- ASQ:SE-2 Learning activities promote adult—child interaction and key social-emotional skills.
- Promote closer parent—child interactions
- Serve as a natural follow-up for children who score in the monitoring zone
