

# ASQ:SE-2 Results Explained



**Greetings!** You may have received your child's screening results through the parent portal in EFS Mod. Remember that screening is a quick check to help you make sure your child is developing on schedule. There are 2 screening questionnaires, the ASQ-3 and the ASQ:SE-2. These questionnaires help us to learn about what's going well for your child as well as areas where we can work together to find ways to provide extra support for your child at home and at school.

The **ASQ:SE-2** asks about social-emotional development and behaviors, including eating and sleeping behaviors.

Your child's **ASQ:SE-2** Screening results look something like this:

**This is what the results mean:**

- **Typical (On-Schedule).** A typical result means your child appears to be doing well in this area.
- **Monitoring.** A result in the monitor area lets us know that your child might benefit from some additional support in their social-emotional development. We can provide them with extra support in the classroom and also share helpful ideas with you for supporting their social-emotional development at home.

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- **Concern.** A result in the Concern area is important to look at. There are many reasons why a result may say it's a "concern". For example, a child who is not hearing well may not be able to follow directions in the classroom. What is most important is to follow up to find out why. Your Early Learning Coalition can help you get more information. A check-in with your child's health care provider may be helpful. In the meantime there are lots of ways to provide extra support for your child at home and in school.

**Where can I get more information? What if I have more questions? What if I have concerns?**

Get in touch with your Early Learning Coalition (ELC), talk to your primary health care provider, and keep connecting with your child's teacher. **From birth to age 5, your child's brain develops faster than at any other time in life.** This is a great time to support your child's development.
